Lemonade Stand

All of the Exclusive Resources included with the HWL Membership are open-ended and full of imaginative play and learning. However, sometimes it is helpful to be given a few ideas to get started. So, here are some sparks to get you started:

Imaginative Play

- Welcome to your very own Lemonade Stand! This month is full of imagination as your child sets up their very own Lemonade Stand. From being a chef to a store owner, the imaginative play possibilities are endless.

Literacy

- Little Ones: Young children will be building vocabulary and oral language skills as they chat about their lemonade recipe, share their selling pitches, and discuss their store name! Printing skills and copy work can be practiced with the “What’s the Name of your Lemonade Stand?” page.
- Older Children: Challenge older children to figure out their Lemonade Stand name with the “What’s the Name of your Lemonade Stand?” page. Encourage them to read and follow the directions for making their own lemonade as well! Oral language skills will be built for our older children as well as they play.

Math

- Little Ones: Practice counting with the lemon cards! Count the lemons and clip a clothespin on the correct numeral. This practices counting, one-to-one correspondence, and number recognition. You can introduce some simple money math as well, using the \$1 and \$2 bills or coins.

- Older Children: It’s time to practice money math with this shop! You can make bundle deals with your child or require change for your purchase! Completing the puzzle is another great (and fun!) way to build math skills.

Art

- Have your child create their very own, branded lemonade cup! The printable includes an option for your child to create a cover for a real cup or use the printable bottom to create a full cup for imaginative play.

Fine Motor Skills

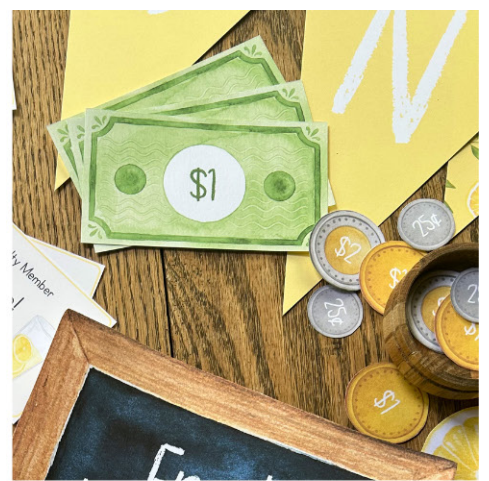
- Clipping clothespins onto the number cards is a great way to build fine motor skills. And so is using scissors! Don’t worry about the neatness of it and have your child help you cut out the banner and string it all together. These scissor skills are important to practice and a fabulous way to strengthen little hands and fine motor skills.

Critical Thinking and Problem Solving

- Playing the Matching Game is a wonderful way for children to strengthen their critical thinking AND problem solving skills. The lemon puzzle is a second way to practice these skills with your child this month. Finally, playing with your lemonade stand will offer lots of opportunities for your child to think critically and solve problems. Perhaps there is a customer who wants 10 glasses – how can they carry them home? Or perhaps a customer spilled their glass of lemonade – should they get another glass for free? Get creative and watch your little one soar!

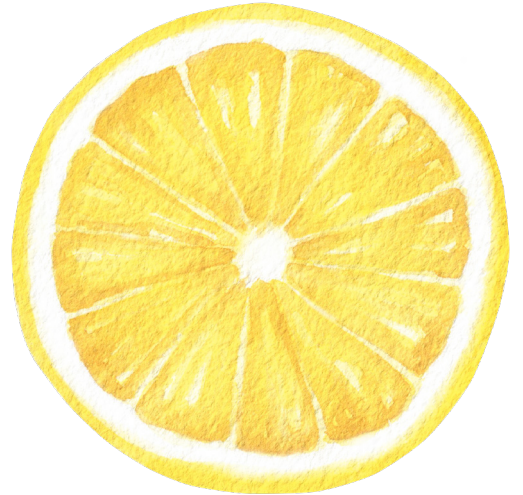
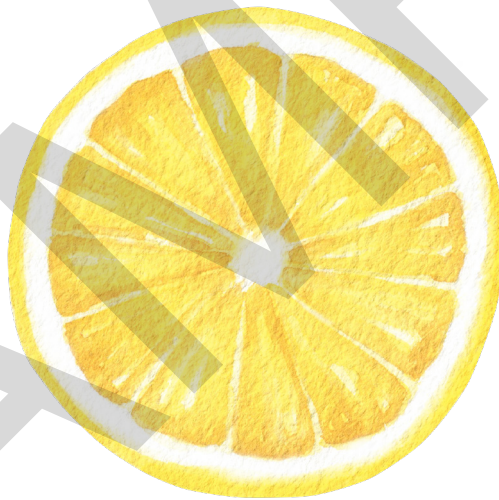
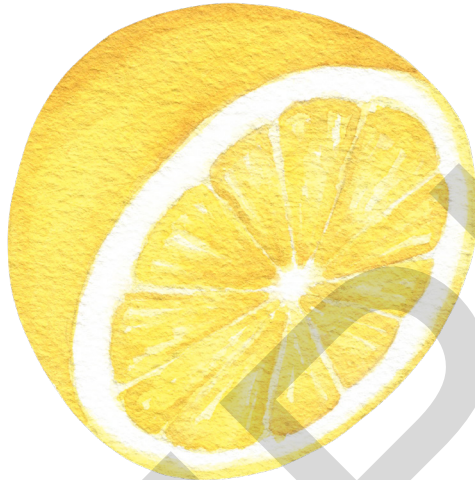

Ingredients



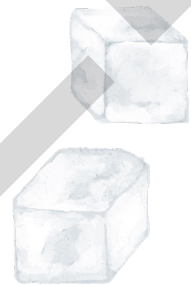
6 Lemons

Directions

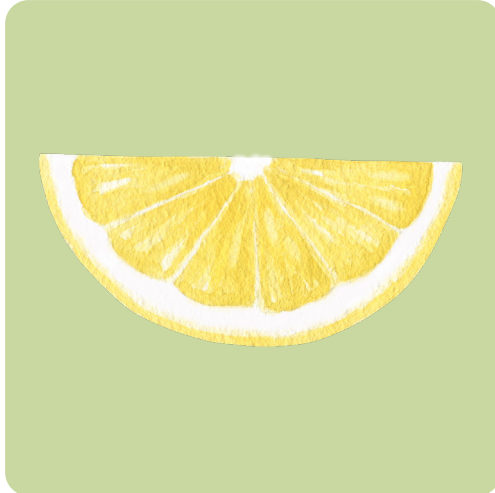
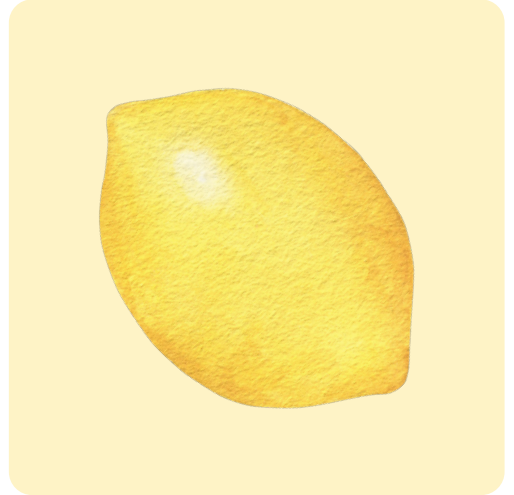
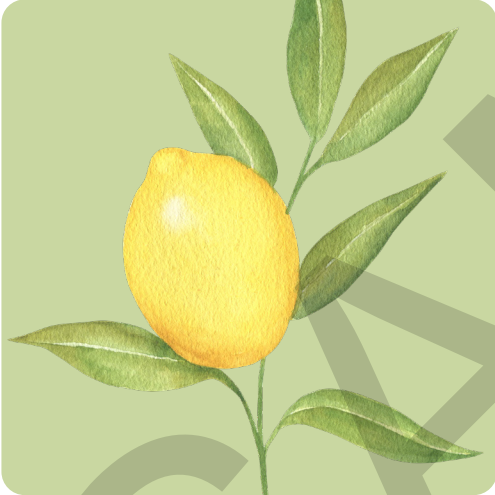
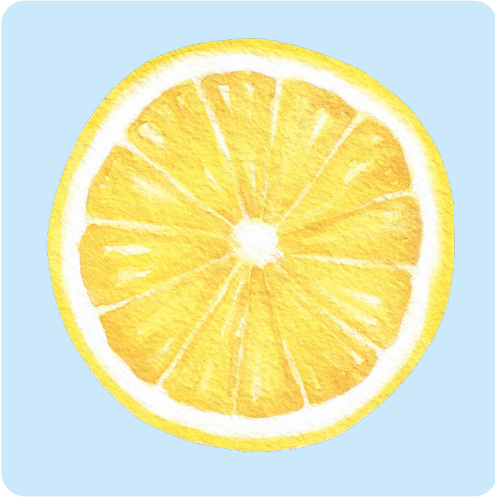
- Step 1: Juice lemons until you have 1 cup of juice (4-6 lemons).

- Step 5: Serve and enjoy!

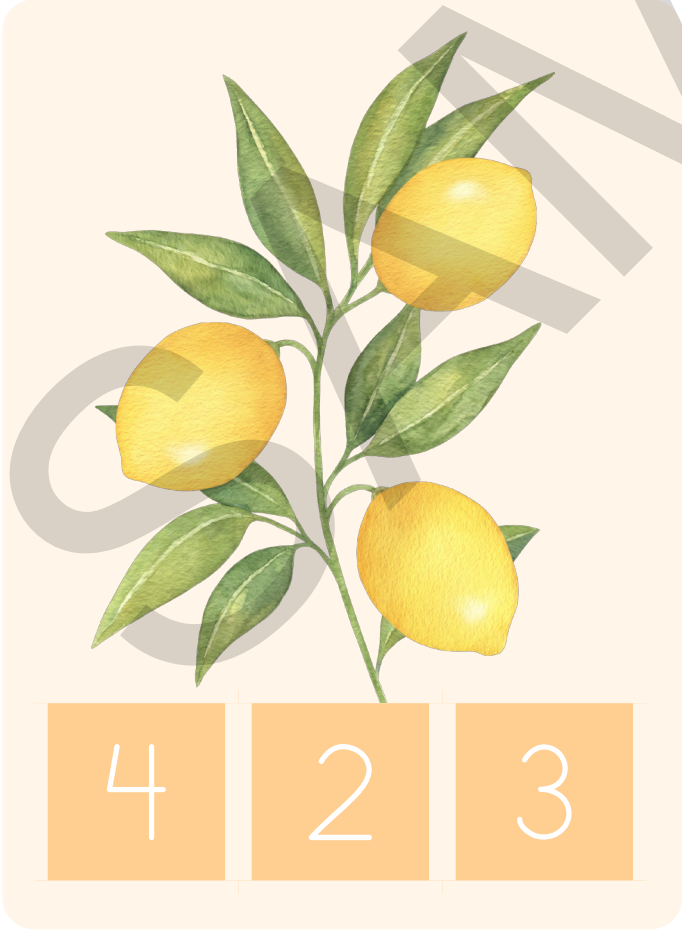
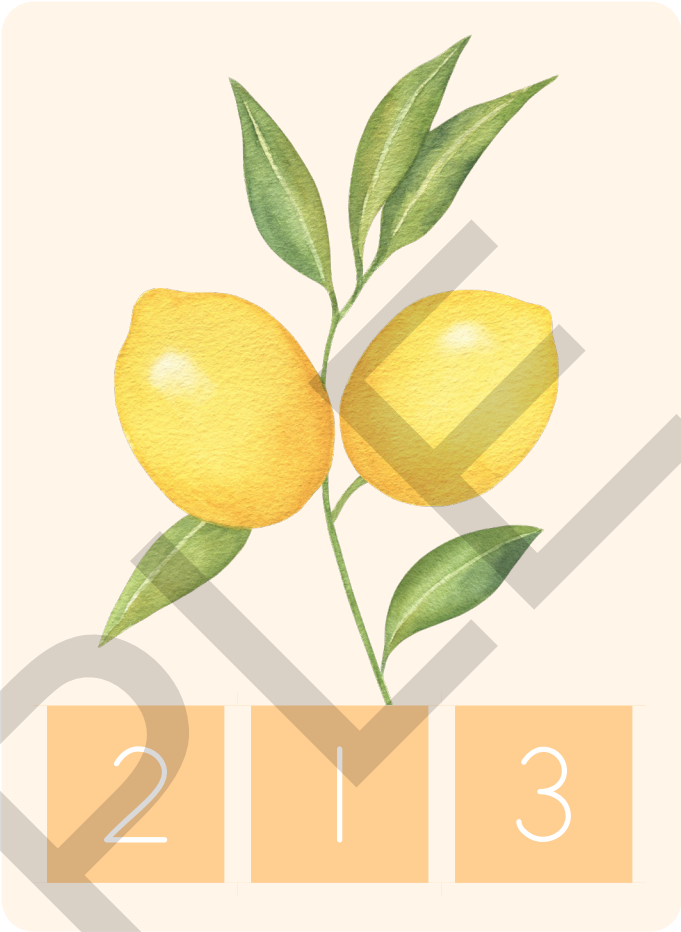
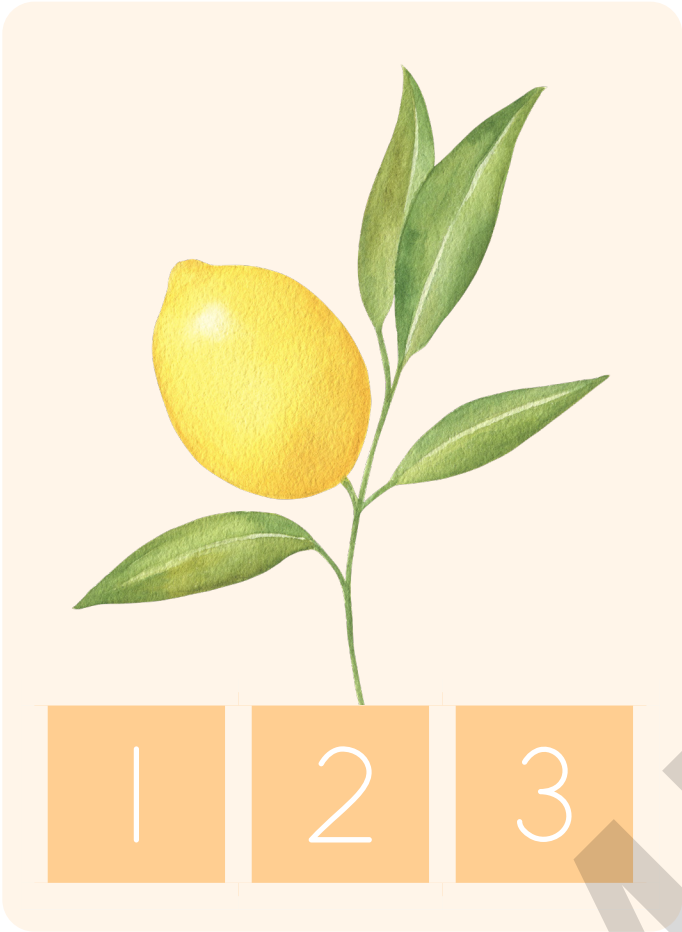




DIY Ideas

Below are a few pretend play and additional activities perfect for incorporating with your Lemonade Stand theme!

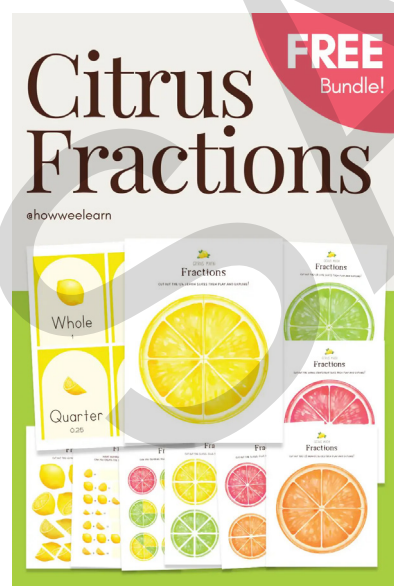
Pretend Play & Additional Activities

- **Cardboard Lemonade Stand:** If you have some big cardboard boxes handy, turn them into a lemonade stand! Your little one can have fun coloring or painting the stand, adding decorations, and setting it up just so.
- **Lemon Scented Playdough:** Whip up a batch of no-cook playdough ([howweelearn.com/the-best-easy-no-cook-play-doh-recipe/](https://www.howweelearn.com/the-best-easy-no-cook-play-doh-recipe/)), and add some yellow food coloring and lemon zest or lemon extract for a deliciously fresh lemony scent.
- **Cardboard Lemonade Pitcher:** Happy Toddler Playtime has a wonderful tutorial on how to create a cardboard pitcher that actually looks like it's pouring lemonade!

- **Pretend Lemonade:** You can make some real lemonade for your little one to serve, or get imaginative and use yellow pompoms, scrunched up yellow tissue paper, your yellow scented playdough, or even rice.

Additional Activities

- **STEM Challenge:** Challenge your child to build a lemonade stand from LEGO, popsicle sticks, or blocks!
- **Sensory Bin:** Fill a shallow bin with water and add some lemon slices and ice cubes. Pop in a whisk, spoon, and some cups and bowls, and your little one can have fun scooping, mixing, and playing.

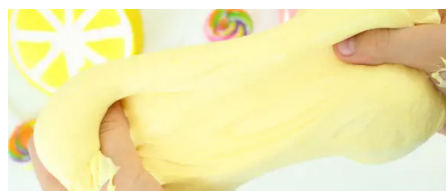
